Those who have Japanese language proficiency equivalent to or above A1 in the "Frame of Reference for Japanese Language Education" are as follows.

- 1 Have Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) N5 or above certification.
- 2 Have scored 300 or above on the BJT Business Japanese Proficiency Test.
- 3 Have been certified as having F level or above in the J.TEST Test of Practical Japanese or have scored 250 or above in the FG level test.
- 4 Have Japanese language NAT-TEST Level 5 or above certification.
- 5 Have scored 350 or above on the STBJ Standard Business Japanese Test.
- 6 Have been certified at or above beginner level A in the TOPJ Practical Japanese Proficiency Test.
- 7 Have been certified at or above beginner level in the Certificate of Japanese as a Foreign Language.
- 8 Have been certified as JCT 5 or higher on the JLCT Japanese Language Proficiency Test for Foreigners.
- 9 Have been certified with a C- or higher in the Practical Japanese Communication Test Bridge (PJC Bridge).
- 10 Have scored 315 or above on the JPT Japanese Language Proficiency Test or scored 68 or above on the JPT Elementary Test

The above is as of January 2025, as stipulated on the Immigration Services Agency's website "Japanese language proficiency for admission to Japanese language educational institutions." If there are any additions or changes to the standards in the future, they will apply.
